

Data Protection for website visitors

according to art. 13 GDPR

1. General information about visiting our website

On each visit to our website, our system automatically collects data and information from the computer system of the calling computer.

The following data is collected in the process:

- Information on the type and version of internet browser used to access the website
- Operating system of the user
- IP address of the user
- Date and time of each access
- Web pages, from which the user was redirected to our website

The data mentioned above is stored within the scope of the statutory provisions. It is stored for data security reasons to ensure the stability and operational security of our system. This in accordance with the legal basis for the temporary storage of data and log files re. art. 6 para. 1 lett. f GDPR.

2. Cookies

We use cookies on our website to ensure a user-friendly experience. Cookies are small files that are managed by the user's web browser and are directly stored on the respective device (Laptop, Tablet, Smartphone etc.) whenever you visit our website. The cookies remain stored until you delete them. This process allows us to recognize your browser on your next visit.

If you do not wish to use cookies you can change the settings in your browser accordingly. You will then be notified whenever your browser attempts to create a cookie and you can decide whether you want to allow the cookie. However, please note that a deactivation of cookies may result in a limited user experience and you may not be able to use every function of our website.

The legal basis for the processing of data through cookies is art. 6 para. 1 lett. f GDPR.

Most of the cookies we use are so-called «session cookies» or temporary cookies. They are automatically deleted after the end of your website visit. Permanent cookies however remain in your internet browser according to your own specifications or until they are manually deleted.

In our cookies-note all cookies are listed, sorted according to function and explained in detail. You can adapt and individualise your settings and thus allow or reject only the necessary cookies or all cookies (incl. statistics, marketing, etc.).

3. Contact form and e-mail contact

If you fill out a contact form or send us an email or another form of electronic message, your data will only be used to process your inquiry and possible further questions you might have.

The legal basis for the processing of your inquiry is art. 6 para. 1 lett. b GDPR.

We will delete your e-mail address after completing your inquiry.



4. Website analysis using Matomo

This website uses Matomo (formerly Piwik), an open source software application for the statistical analysis of visitor access. The provider of Matomo software is InnoCraft Ltd, 150 Willis St, 6011 Wellington, New Zealand. Matomo cookies are set on the basis of Art. 6 Para. 1 lit. f GDPR. As operators of this website, we have a legitimate interest in the anonymised analysis of user behaviour in order to optimise both our web offerings and advertising.

Matomo uses cookies, which are text files stored on your computer and enable the analysis of how you use the website. With the help of the tracking tool Matomo, the behavior of visitors to the website can be evaluated and their interests analysed. For this purpose, we create a pseudonymous user profile.

The information generated by the cookie about your use of the website is stored on a server in Switzerland. The IP address is anonymised immediately after processing and before the information is stored. You have the possibility to prevent the installation of cookies by changing the settings of your browser software. However, we would like to point out that by deactivating the cookies, not all functions of this website may be available.

You can obtain more information about the Matomo software privacy settings via the following link: https://matomo.org/docs/privacy/. The recipients of the data may be technical service providers who act as outsourced processors for the operation and maintenance of our website. The data will be deleted as soon as it is no longer required for our recording purposes. In our case, this takes place after a period of six months. The provision of your personal data is voluntary, solely on the basis of your consent.

Alternatively you can adapt and individualise your settings and thus allow or reject only the necessary cookies or all cookies (incl. Matomo).

5. Newsletter

If you subscribe to our newsletter on our website we need information on your e-mail address and further information which allows us to verify that you are the owner of the e-mail address and that you agree with the newsletter subscription. Furthermore, for the purpose of personalization, we store the following data: title, first name and surname as well as the language you select. Additional data are not collected or only on a voluntary basis. We use this data exclusively for sending the requested information and do not pass it on to third parties. The processing of the data entered in the newsletter registration form takes place exclusively on the basis of your consent (art. 6 para. 1 lett. a GDPR). You can unsubscribe from the newsletter at any time by sending an e-mail to contact@iuf.li and thus cancel your agreement to store your data, the e-mail address as well as the use for the dispatch of the newsletter. The data processing operations already carried out remains unaffected by the revocation.

The data you provide for the purpose of receiving the newsletter will be stored by us until you unsubscribe from the newsletter and will be deleted after you unsubscribe from the newsletter. Data that has been stored by us for other purposes remains unaffected by this.

6. SSL-Encryption

Within your website visit we use a state-of-the-art TLS-procedure in connection with the highest encryption levels that are supported by your browser. If a page on our website was/is being transmitted encrypted it is shown by the lock symbol in the address bar of your browser.

Additionally, we use appropriate technical and organizational security measures to protect your data from accidental or intentional manipulation, partial or complete loss, destruction, or to prevent unauthorized access by third parties. Our security measures are continuously upgraded according to the latest technological developments.



7. E-mails sent to us

Please note that – subject to an explicit agreement and configuration – e-mails to us are sent unencrypted.

8. Your rights (rights of the persons affected)

You have the right to request information about any of your personal data we process. In particular, you have the right to request information about the purpose of the processing, the categories of personal data, the categories of recipients who will have access or were disclosed with your data, the duration periods for saving the personal data, whether there is a right to adjust/correct, erase, restrict or object, transmission of data, the source of your data if not collected through us and if we use automatic decision-making technologies including profiling.

Additionally, you have the right to revoke a previously granted consent to use your personal data at any time.

If you believe that the processing of your personal data is inconsistent or contradicts the applicable data protection laws you have the possibility to lodge a complaint with the Data Protection Authority of the Principality of Liechtenstein (www.datenschutzstelle.li).
